Tuition

- Insurances have risen significantly over the past few years
- Funding of pension costs for employees have risen significantly
- Rising inflation has also caused cost increases across the expense base
- The remainder of the revenues needed to cover operating expenses come from
 - Fundraising and contributions
 - Reimbursement of NYS Mandated Services
 - Diocesan support through Elizabeth Ann Seton Fund

Futures in Education

2023-2024 Tuition Assistance is available for eligible students in grade K-8, who attend a Brooklyn or Queens Catholic School or Academy.

- Partial scholarships from \$500 up to \$3,200 per student, not to exceed
 75% of tuition
- Scholarship awards are assessed on a needs basis considering household size and total annual income using the guidelines of the National School Lunch Program

- Any approved assistance is for one year only and NOT carried forward




17% of the families of our school participated in the 2023 Catholic Identity Defining Characteristics Parent and Community Survey


23% of the families of our school participated in the 2023 St. Francis de Sales Catholic Academy Family Survey

children. C15: Everyone connected with our school works together, respecting each other's gifts, for the sake of building a strong, faith-filled learning community.



It is important that children attend school regularly and arrive on time daily. Time on learning matters and makes a significant difference in student learning and social-emotional development. As you can imagine, multiple absences and tardiness create significant learning gaps, making it increasingly difficult for a child to keep up with the class routines and curriculum.

Here are a few practical tips to help support regular attendance:

- Make sure your child(ren) keep a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Layout clothes and pack backpacks the night before school.
- Ensure your children attend school every day, unless they are truly sick.
- Avoid scheduling vacations or doctor's appointments when school is in session.
- Talk to teachers, counselors, or school administration for advice if your child(ren) feels anxious about going to school.

2023-2024 School Year Continuation of I-Ready

Continuing in the 2023-24 school year; SFDS will be implementing, through the Diocese, the i-Ready Assessment in grades K-8 as our school wide assessment in reading and math.

i-Ready is an interactive online program that is designed to not only provide an assessment of student progress, but also an individualized instructional plan for each student. i-Ready starts the process with an adaptive diagnostic test that identifies the students' current academic level.

As a result of the i-Ready process, teachers gain real-time access to reports that identify the needs of your child and are given additional curricular resources to continue and accelerate student growth on select assessed standards. Parents also receive detailed reports of where their children are performing. Including a target score for the next assessment, as well as their child's Lexile range used for selecting the correct reading level for their child. i-Ready also provides students a digital instruction supplement where students are able to work independently on targeted activities based on your students' needs.
